CLASS ORGANISATION 2023-24

We received confirmation of our class organisation for session 2023 / 2024. We have been allocated two Primary 1 classes and a P1 / 2 composite class. The City of Edinburgh Council provides schools with the criteria for the creation of composite classes: the youngest P2 pupils will join with the oldest P1 pupils to form the class. The maximum class size for a composite class is 25 pupils. As happens every year at Sciennes, the current P1 pupils will be re-organised into their new classes by Ms Anstruther and the P1 team. A great deal of thought and planning goes into the creation of the new classes. The children will be given the chance to play and get to know each other before the end of this term. They will also meet their new P2 teacher. We will be in touch in due course with information regarding classes and staffing for next session.

BUILDING WORKS

Maxi Construction is currently on track to complete delivery of the new £2.7m two storey classroom block at the rear of the school by the end of term. The Site Management team has been working closely with Ms Anstruther and the school's pupil 'Building Reps' whilst on site and recently asked the children to get creative through a Safety Poster Competition and STEM activity. Children were informed about the possible dangers on construction sites and were asked to participate in creating a site safety poster that would help towards keeping people safe. The entries were exceptionally creative with the use of vibrant colours, excellent illustrations and valuable information relating to health and safety in construction. The winners (Maria P2b, Neo P2c, Ben P3a, and Rhona P3a) were awarded with a gift voucher and Maxi water bottle and notebook. The winning designs are now displayed on a banner attached to railings at the front of the school.
